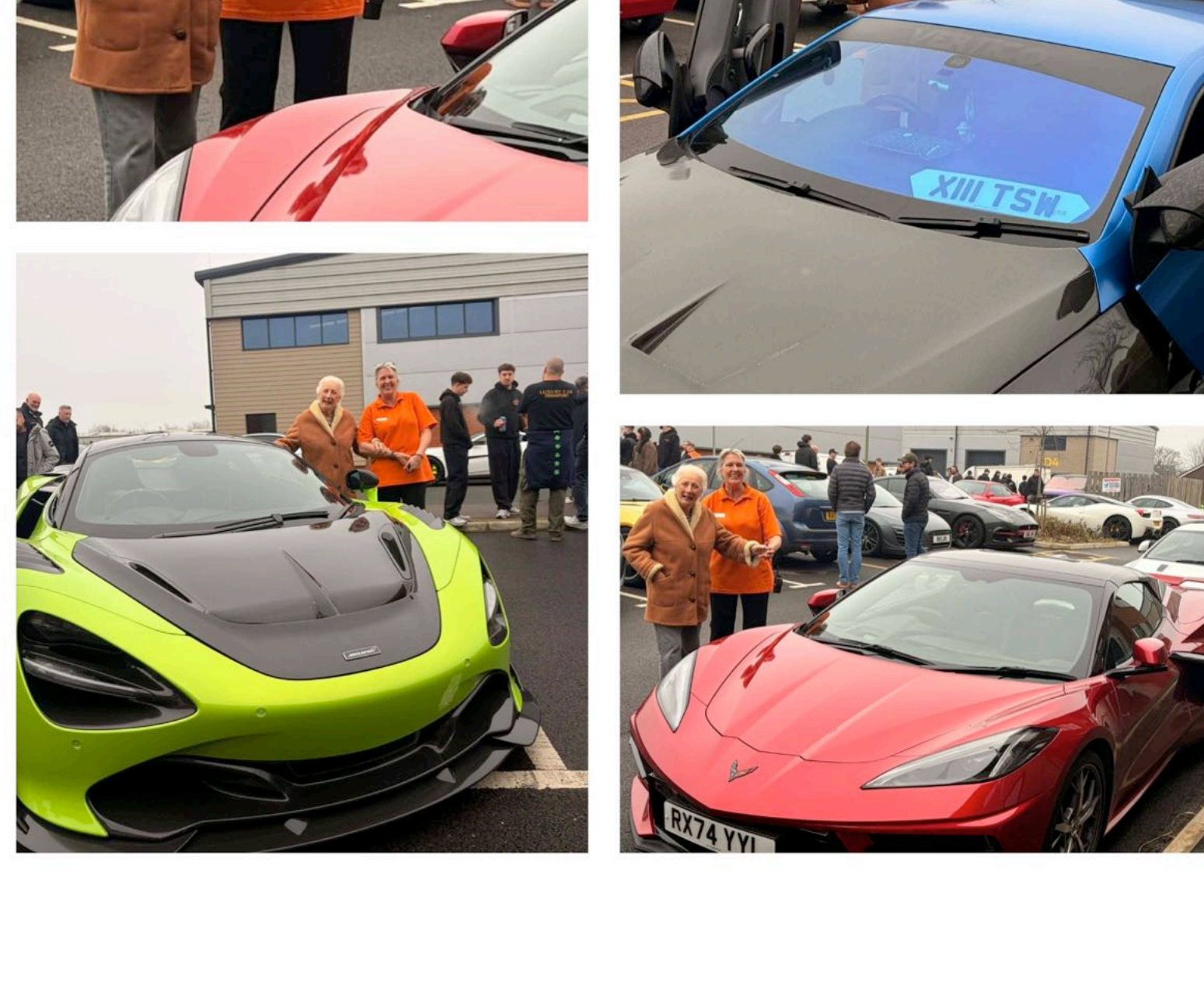
## RECENT HIGHLIGHTS

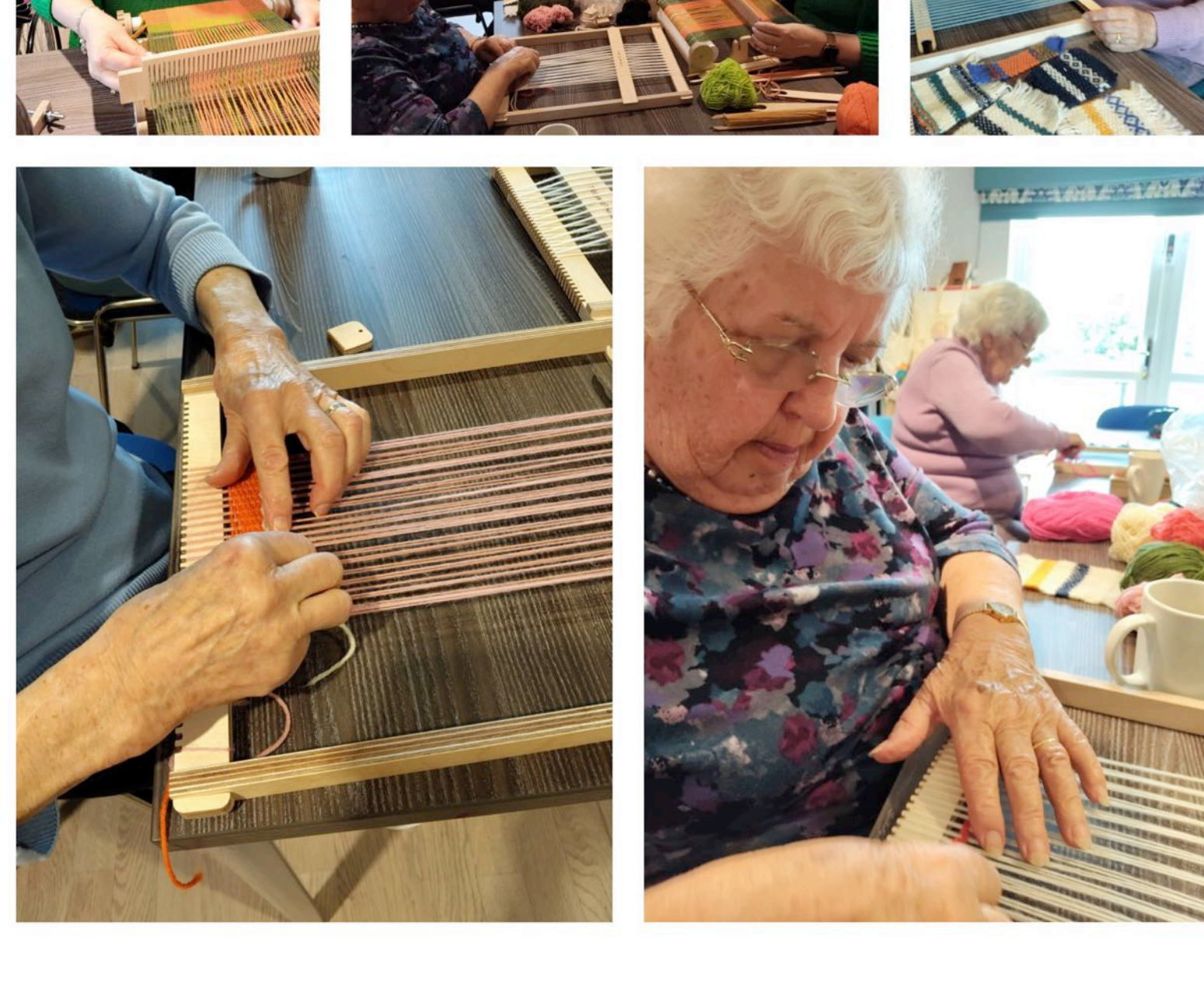


### Weaving Workshop

There was plenty of friendly competition as everyone chose their horses and cheered them on. It was an enjoyable day that encouraged conversation and brought a shared sense of fun to the home.



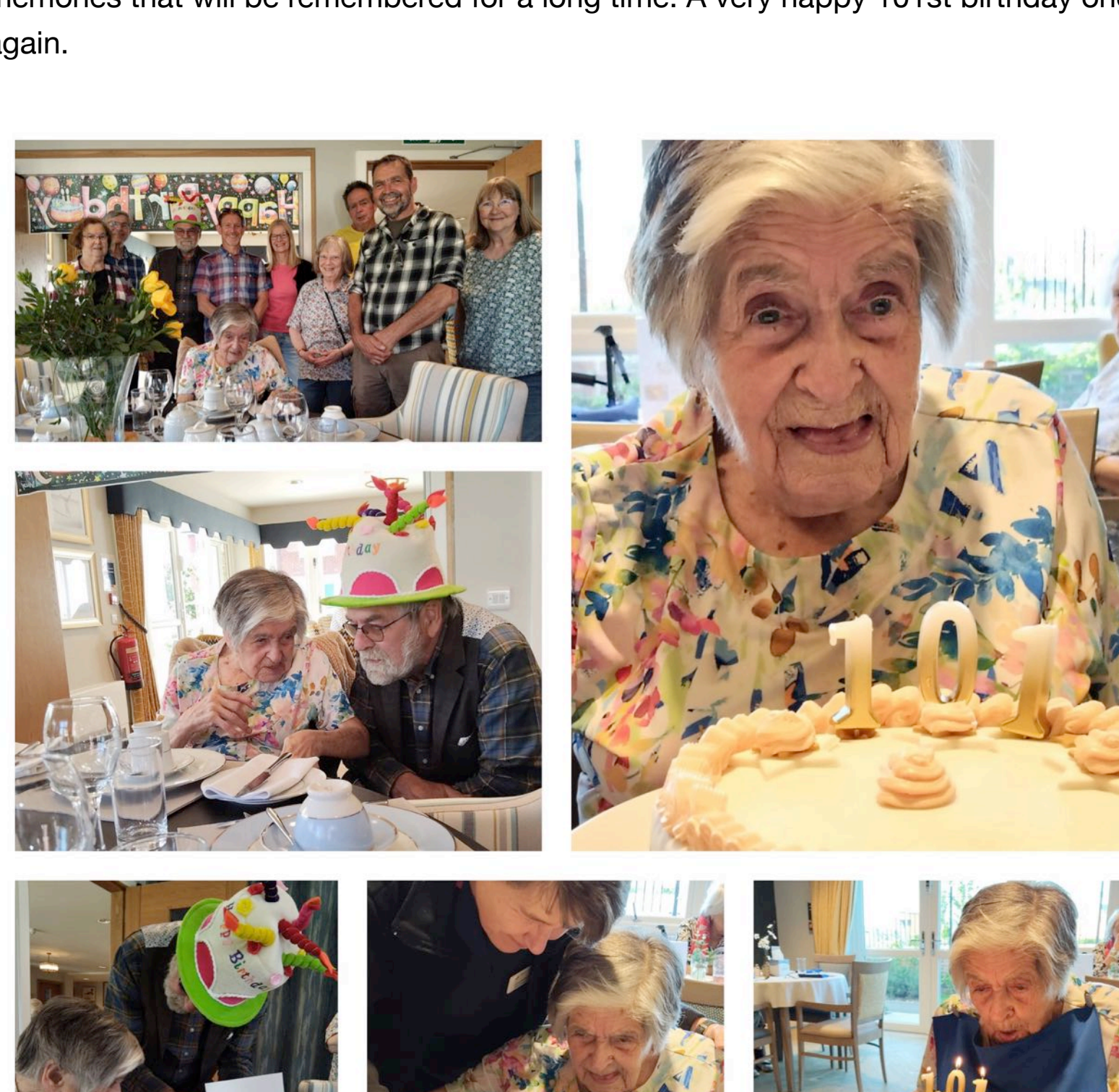
## MEANINGFUL MOMENTS

Moments like these are important for residents, families, and staff alike, creating memories that will be remembered for a long time. A very happy 101st birthday once again.

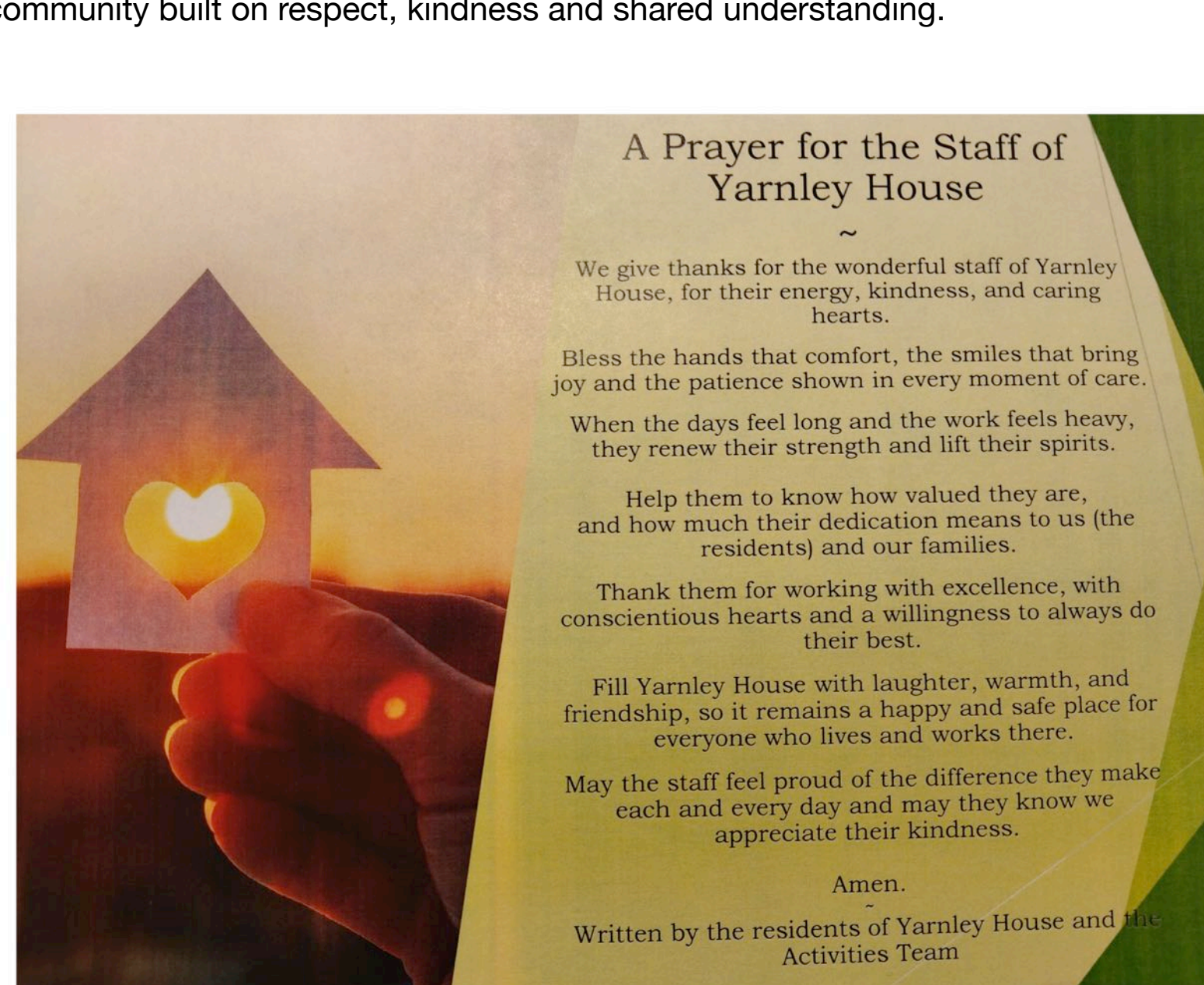


### Writing A Prayer
